## A Garden Lamentation

I come to the garden alone. And there, I am at peace. I cannot make it rain. I cannot stop the rain. I am happy when the wasps and butterflies come and I accept that they are not meant to stay. Each sprout surprises me, even if I planted the seeds. Even if I do nothing, things will grow—pumpkins from last year's compost, dandelions that give the bees the first food of the spring, and unknown weeds that startle me with purple blossoms. In the garden, surrounded by the goodness of growing things, I am also good.

When I leave the garden, I ask, "Am I good?" It is an endless question: Am I a good driver? Am I a good neighbor? Am I a good mother? A good daughter? A good person? It is a type of beseeching prayer—I want to be good. I want to be very, very good. At the very least, I want to be good enough to be at peace.

Instead, peace eludes me. So, I pursue goodness. I eat my vegetables, call my mother, and go to yoga. I write the city council thank you notes and give apologies generously. I pick up sidewalk trash and return library books. I do morning devotionals and evening prayers. Does this make me good? Peace comes and then goes, like the monarch butterflies among the milkweed.

I cannot stop the erratic weather of climate change or the extinction of species. I worry about these things. I pray about them. I feel bad when I drive my fossil-fueled car and good when I plant milkweed for the monarchs that will pass through. It takes four generations for the monarchs to reach Oyamel fir forests. Peace is a long journey too. Maybe I am not the generation who will arrive but it is enough to be going in the right direction. I do not doubt that each monarch butterfly is good. I will think about that more when I return to in the garden and am at peace.




