## Whom Will You Serve?

A few of us may have made our first commitment to follow the Lord on this day. For most of us, we likely made that commitment and were baptized some years or even decades ago. In the scripture text, Joshua asks the people of Israel to choose whom they will serve. The Israelites served the Lord for generations, but the question is still put to them because, although the Lord had been faithful to the people, still they were unclear in their commitment and still served other gods.

On the cover of this bulletin are two men with smiling faces. What do you see when you look at them? You do not need to know the two men in the photo to see the joy of those who chose to serve the Lord wholeheartedly. Since I do happen to know the two men in the photo, Athanasus from South Sudan and Sandy from the Dominican Republic, I know something of how they live their lives. I know each has been Brethren for some years, is a leader in their church, and exhibits a passion for serving the Lord. I know something of how the Lord has blessed each. Whatever their internal struggles, I am sure when asked, both will enthusiastically say that they will serve the Lord.

What about us? What about you? When strangers see you, when a friend or colleague sees you, when you examine your own life, is it clear whom you serve? Likely if we are honest, we do not always serve the Lord as well as we might wish. Yet each day is an opportunity to remember what the Lord has done for us and recommit to serve the Lord so we can say with confidence and joy, "We serve the Lord!"

In the spring of 1966, in Shade Gap, PA, 17-year old Peggy Ann Bradnick got off the school bus with her siblings, only to be abducted by a masked man with a shotgun. Her 8-day ordeal sparked a multi-state manhunt and made international headlines.

This is Peggy's story in her own words. It is one of forgiveness and grace. Peggy Ann Bradnick Jackson is a woman of great faith whose quiet strength will astound you.
