# **Building with Truth and Grace**

Daddy was a carpenter. He loved to make things. He showed me the rewards of applying creativity, knowledge, and skill to fixing, designing, and building. He taught me to take things apart to see how they worked and to find joy in making things "the right way" to serve their purpose in beautiful and lasting ways.

Mama was a pastor. She lived to open people's hearts to God's healing and reconciling love. In word and deed she taught me that tenderness and justice were of a piece—the personal *and* public expressions of love. She was also the bravest communicator I've ever known. When she sensed tension in relationships, she moved in . . . to listen and understand, trusting the Spirit to lead.

I worked my way through seminary as a carpenter. Paired with my studies of scripture, theology, and pastoring, the life lessons overflowed! I quickly discovered that homeowners didn't always want to know all the problems with their homes or pay me to fix everything I found. I also learned that church members and congregations can have pain they don't feel ready to acknowledge, let alone examine or tend.


Ephesians speaks powerfully in words both beautiful and ridiculous: "Speak the truth . . . we belong to each other!" But also: "Speak only in ways that build each other up." After 25 years in ministry I still feel stretched to both speak truth and bear grace. But my parents and countless others have shined light on this constant challenge.

Following Jesus takes a desire to grow, courage to learn another's truth, patience to be kind, and persistence in the pursuit of justice and dignity for all. It can feel impossible when we're going it alone . . . but in community, and with practice, God's gifts of creativity and grace abound!


