The Novel Bunch

Surviving Savannah

by Patti Callahan was inspired by the true and tragic story of the 1838 sinking of the luxury steamship *Pulaski* with Savannah's elite families on board. The *Pulaski* is now known as the "Titanic of the South." Everly Winthrop, a history professor grieving the death of her best friend, is asked to curate an exhibit at a new museum, focusing on artifacts recovered from the *Pulaski* 180 years after it sank. 


