Its leaves shall stay green

Barbara Brown Taylor wrote, "The gospel is terrible news before it is good news." Our scripture from Jeremiah is a microcosm of that observation, as is the book of Jeremiah as a whole.

This is especially true for the unrighteous, as Jeremiah points out that such people are cursed, that they "shall not see when relief comes" and that they "shall live in the parched places of the wilderness." The good news is that "Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord." Then we read, "They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes; and its leaves shall stay green. In the year of drought, it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit."


The Old Testament is full of terrible news followed by good news! And then came the angel who proclaimed the "good news of great joy that will be for all the people." The good news was Jesus. Jesus himself brought good news to all people. He also said, "I am the vine, you are the branches. If you remain in me, and I in you, you will bear much fruit."

If we, the branches, stay attached to the vine that is Jesus, our leaves will stay green, too!


Looking for Salvation at the Dairy Queen
