# We act with great boldness

Kingian Nonviolence Principle 1: "Nonviolence is a way of life for courageous people."

Reflecting on today's verses, I write as one who is privileged not to experience systemic harm. I recall the acts of courage and boldness that invite us to witness a truth from which we all too often hide our attention. I am thinking of Malala Yousafzei (who was shot for going to school as a girl and continues to advocate for education for girls), Darnella Frazier (who filmed and posted the murder of George Floyd), Mamie Till (the mother of Emmett Till who insisted on an open casket for her son so that the world could see the brutality of racial violence in the US), and many others who acted to show us the harsh realities of oppression. Jesus could be added to this list.


Could the Corinthian church be us? The predominantly white, affluent people trying to do church with neighbors, people who have been shown God's spirit but need to be reminded to act in the spirit. Are we waiting for "letters of recommendation" (2 Corinthians 3:1) before we react or act as God called us? What if we applied 2 Corinthians 4:1-2 to the unveiling of racism in our midst, as the Standing with People of Color study action team invites us? What if "we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word" and boldly act in the face of injustice and oppression, confess our complicity, work to receive and discover the truth? What if, "by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God," and become a Beloved Community of faith that repents and repairs and grows in our relationships as siblings in Christ?

We are ministers of a new covenant, a priesthood of all believers. Let us grow in faith so that we may bear witness to the way of Christ.


# Looking for Salvation at the Dairy Queen

The major theme of this novel is forgiveness, which causes the reader to ponder...how do we really forgive?
