Believe in your heart

On the cover are three house sparrows sitting in a tree. I confess my ambivalence about them. They are rather abundant at my bird feeders. Last year I put up a martin house in hopes of attracting purple martins. But the sparrows arrived first and claimed the space. They are so ordinary-looking, and their song is a repetitive chirp.


I wonder if the early Christians had a similar ambivalence. The apostle Paul seems to hint that they had a preference for people attracted to their house churches. Many came from Jewish backgrounds with all the rich traditions of being a set-apart people. Could they welcome folks into the fold who knew little of the requirements of the Law? Could they trust that a spoken promise of belief in Jesus Christ was enough?

Paul helps them think it through by reminding his Roman friends that believing in the heart is the beginning of discipleship. He assures them that God, the compassionate One, looks on the inside of each person, where the intentions lie. Promises are the beginning. Paul encourages them to trust. These strangers are really friends and have much to offer to the community. Relax, he says. Jews and Greeks are really on the same page. Even Scripture agrees.

Lent is a good season for us to take some time to notice our preferences. Do we unknowingly avoid some folks in our church or community who seem different? Maybe they practice their faith in ways that are unfamiliar. Perhaps they use a different language or have grown up in a different culture. Can we still welcome them and see them as our sisters and brothers? Can we move beyond race and class to find a richer relationship? Just like my house sparrows. How good it is to know that God sees with the heart.



Sometimes you have to return to the place where you began to arrive at the place where you belong.


