

The cup of salvation

If you have attended as many love feasts as I have, it is likely you have heard it said that the reason Jesus washed the feet of his disciples was because none of them were willing to stoop low enough to be a humble servant. This is a powerful story and is consistent with Jesus calling us all to serve one another.

This version of the story is highly unlikely. For one thing, John's Gospel tells us that "Jesus got up from table" before washing feet. Culturally, it is unacceptable for anyone to enter a building or sit at a table without first washing the dust off one's feet. There are many places in the world today where everyone leaves shoes outside. It was similar in Jesus' day and his disciples were also part of this culture.

More than thirty years ago, while planning a love feast service, I decided to follow the biblical story of the feetwashing and start with the meal. Feetwashing occurs after the meal so that everyone, like Jesus, can get up from table. In all my years as a pastor, I have used this order of service, no one has complained, and most prefer it.

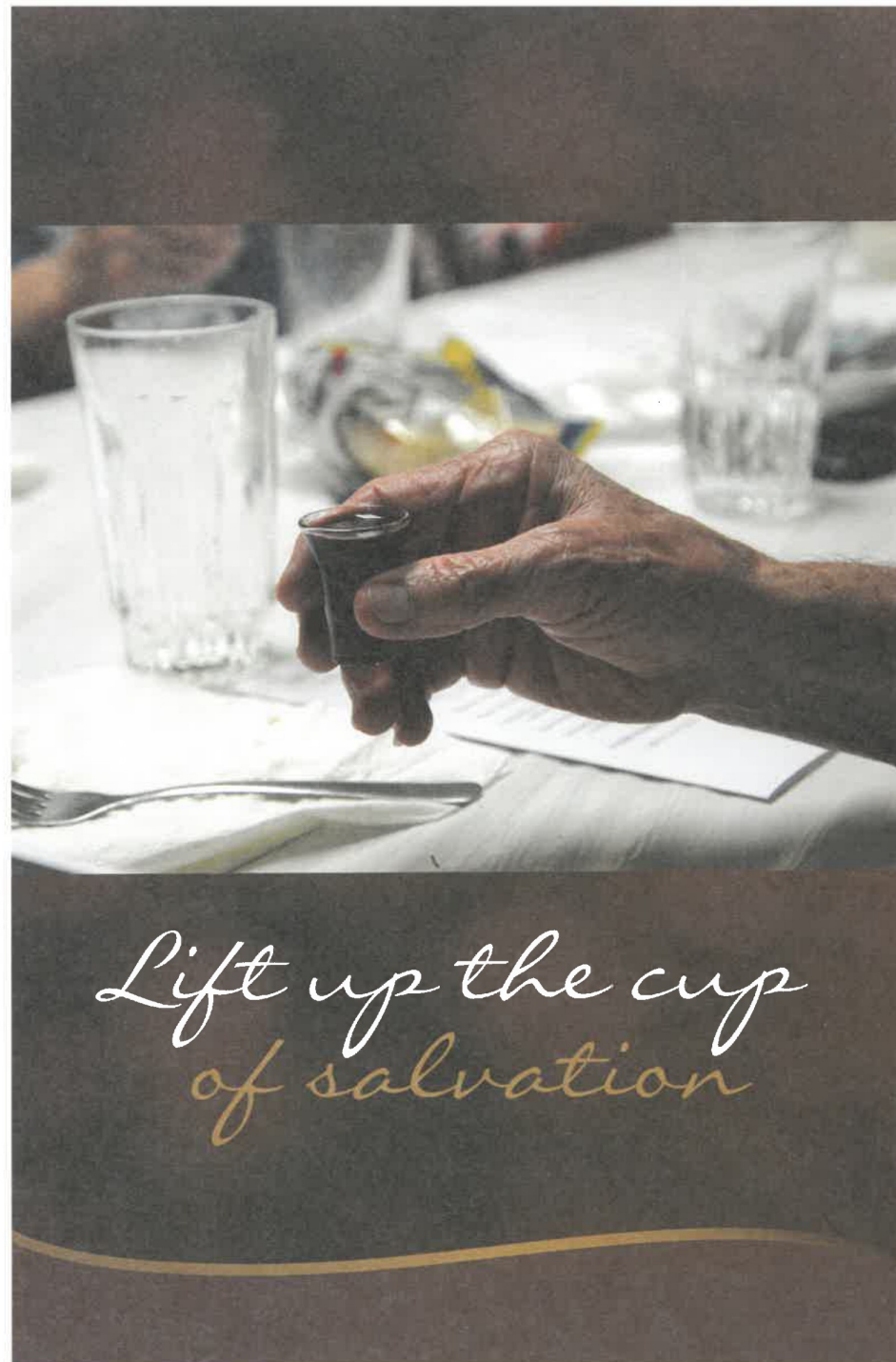
I have come to believe that Jesus' reason for washing the feet of his followers is to commission them for their journey ahead. Our feet move us into the world and Jesus still invites us to go forth and share the good news. Our love feast ritual is an act of commissioning one another for the days and the work ahead.

Be assured that it does not matter *how* we do love feast as long as we *do* it. Jesus always beckons us to join him on the journey and the journey is long. Come and go to be blessed.

Service of Feetwashing

SCRIPTURE READING

John 13:1-17

NT 107

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had
come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own
who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it
into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper
Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he
had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his
outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a ba-
sin and began to wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that
was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are
you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I
am doing, but later you will understand." Peter said to him, "You will never
wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with
me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and
my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need *(Continue)*

to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them.
