So that my soul may praise you

Psalm 30 is one of abounding joy and faith, a celebratory prayer of all God's glory. When I first read it, I could almost hear it singing to me. Its melodious rhythm encourages passion, its bubbly verbiage clings to the soul. It reminds us of all the good things God provides for us, and recognizes that the world isn't perfect either.

The part that is most profound to me is verse 12: "That my heart may sing your praises and not be silent. Lord my God, I will praise you forever" (NIV). I find that it is easy to keep my faith to myself. I'm not one to press my faith on others, because that's not my style. I want everyone to experience their faith for themselves, and if they happen to ask about mine, that's great!


But most likely this approach to sharing God's praise won't bring new people to God. If I don't share about God's praise, how will others know about God's amazing presence? I cannot allow myself to be quiet, for if I am to praise God forever, does that doom me to a lifetime of silence? Openly praising God for all things good isn't pressing my faith to others, it simply shares it. Why would I want to stifle that love and joy within me?

Sharing about the Church of the Brethren is important, not just for the future of the denomination, but for the greater good of God's children. Because of this, I choose to thank God for all that God has enabled me to be, do, and feel. I will not be silent, and I encourage you to do the same.
