A new, old thing

Scripture contains an interesting balance, encouraging people to both remember the old and anticipate the new. For instance, in the book of Isaiah, God says, "Do not remember the former things or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth; do you not perceive it?" (43:18-19a). And then just three chapters later, God says, "remember the former things of old, for I am God, and there is no other;" (46:9a). In the first instance, God wants the people to notice God paving a new path out of horrible circumstances. In the second instance, God wants the people to remember how God has always been faithful. At face value, these scriptures seem to contradict one another, but in reality they both name God's consistent presence and activity in the world.

At the end of Revelation, God once again proclaims that something new is happening. God tells of the day when God will be with humanity, but this is not new. In the prologue to John's Gospel, we are told that God took on flesh and came into the world (John 1:1-14). Even before this truly embodied appearance of God in Jesus, God was known to visit the garden when evening's breeze blew (Genesis 3:8), lead wanderers with a pillar of cloud or fire (Exodus 13:21), and speak to people through a variety of angelic messengers.

God desires to be with those whom God created. We see evidence of this throughout scripture. And yet, God is doing something new in Revelation. One day, we are promised that the presence of God will never end. And in that day all things will be made new. In the meantime, be on the lookout, for God has a tendency of showing up. It's a new, old habit.


