Work for the good of all

Most of us would agree that we don't intentionally do good work solely to benefit ourselves. Instead, we seek out ways to help others and to do good for more than just ourselves. This is what Paul calls us to do. However, according to Paul, it is not enough to only do good for some others; we need to do good for all people. While Paul does give a special shout-out to do good for the family of believers, it does not take away from the fact that we are to do good for all people.

When I am looking to do good for others, I initially look at my immediate surroundings and the people I know to see how they can be served. Which means I am not looking at all people, and therefore neglecting part of Paul's teaching. While we can't always help all people, it is something we need to consider.

When we are looking to do good for others, we need to look outside our immediate surroundings and our own community of people. This means looking to do good for people we disagree with, or those who look different from us, or those who worship differently from us, and even those whom we might blame for their circumstances.

So, what does this look like? It doesn't mean we should stop doing good for those in our immediate community surrounding us or the people we spend the majority of our time with. It does mean that when we are looking to do good, we should expand our reach and go out of our way to do good for people in all walks of life, all beliefs, all circumstances. We work to do good for God's people—all people.

Vietnam

A request regarding the Retinopathy of Prematurity Vietnam (ROPVN) project

Grace Mishler, the former Global Mission and Service program volunteer and founder, advisor and advocate for ROPVN Social Work Support services, visited the ongoing ROPVN staff and volunteers from mid-February to mid-April. During her visit, the Childrens Hospital 1 Administrative Working Group developed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the hospital and the ROPVN early intervention program to prevent infant blindness due to Retinopathy of Prematurity. From that visit, these prayer requests have emerged.

Due to governmental policy changes in program approvals, it will take six to nine months before we will be able to purchase a Retina Camera for the Eye Unit to assist doctors and nurses in making the most accurate diagnoses and recommending the best courses of treatment. Pray that this vitally important equipment will be brought online quickly so that accuracy and timeliness of diagnoses might not be compromised.

We offer and request your prayers of gratitude for the warm welcome Grace received and prayers of rejoicing that the MOU has been sent on to the local People's Committee of Ho Chi Minh City for approval. Heartfelt prayers of thanks for the dedication of ROPVN team manager Doanh Thanh, who provided Vietnamese-English translation.

Prayers of thanksgiving and celebration are also offered that this ROPVN 2017 Project Initiative of the Church of the Brethren Global Mission continues to be sustainable. Without the social work team and the gifted surgeon hands of Dr. JD Ferwerda, retina surgeon, 98 infants/children would be blind today. Praise God for the assurance of the ongoing presence of compassionate hearts.
