Lectio divina: Seek the things above

Jeremiah 29:13 says, "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." In Colossians 3:1-3, Paul says to "set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God."

One way Christians have done this for centuries is through a spiritual discipline called *Lectio divina*—"divine or spiritual reading." The practice includes close reading of scripture, meditation, and prayer.

Take some time to practice Lectio divina using Colossians 3:1-11. Follow these traditional steps to help you along the way:

Pray: Start by spending time in silence before God. Expect to hear God speak and ask him to do so through his word.

Read: Read Colossians 3:1-11 aloud. Read it silently, then aloud again.

Meditate: Ruminate or "chew" on the passage as you slowly look it over and think about it deeply. Consider individual phrases. Words. Touch the page if that helps. What does the passage mean? What does it mean for you? Journaling can accompany this step.

Pray: Use the passage as a framework for more prayer. Praise God for truths about him in each verse. Ask God to enable you to follow each of Paul's instructions.

Contemplate: Think on the scripture again. This time, focus on ways you're living in line with this passage . . . and ways you aren't. What might you do to embody it better? To "seek the things above" more fully?

Pray: As a final prayer, thank God for his word. Thank him for any practical insights you've gained during this time. Ask him for grace, faith, wisdom and strength to live out Colossians 3:1-11 every day.

"So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God" (Colossians 3:1, NRSVue). Today's Bible readings from the lectionary: Hosea 11:1-11; Psalm 107:1-9, 43; Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14; 2:18-23; Psalm 49:1-12; Colossians 3:1-11; Luke 12:13-21.


