A cloud of witnesses

More often affectionately known as "The Bean" due to its kidney-like shape, the now-famous sculpture officially titled "Cloud Gate" sits majestically in Chicago's Millennium Park.

Designed by Anish Kapoor and installed in 2004, it quickly became one of the most iconic and most photographed sites in the city. Covered entirely in stainless steel, the 33-foot-tall artwork reflects not only the clouds above it, but also the striking skyline that surrounds it—as well as the many faces of all the eager tourists that flock to it.

One can walk all around it, as well as under it, seeing ever-changing angles along the way. It's surprisingly simple, but also undeniably beautiful. In it, the whole city becomes a work of art.

The "cloud of witnesses" described in Hebrews 11-12 holds a similar, powerful draw. In the faces of all these saints who have gone before us and all those who continue to encourage us along our way today, we see reflections of ourselves and the landscapes we travel. Seeing them from a new perspective and in a new light, we can find community, inspiration, and renewed hope.


