Sincere faith

Growing up in my home congregation in the 1970s meant being a part of Mrs. Moran's junior Sunday school class. Gone were tables with crayons and colorful booklets. Instead, we sat in rows and read Bible passages verse by verse. Soft-spoken but firm, she helped as we stumbled over hard-to-pronounce names and enriched her commentary with personal stories. While I cannot recall much about those lessons, I will always remember her handwritten Christmas cards with a silver dollar taped inside.

Mrs. Moran had the kind of *sincere faith* Paul recognizes in Timothy in verses 3–5 of today's text. Paul's phrase implies a genuine faith, rooted in trust and a relationship with God. Timothy's sincere faith was nurtured through story, song, and the everyday words and actions of people who loved him. For Mrs. Moran and Timothy, faith was more than an inherited tradition; it was visible in their words and actions.


But even sincere faith needs encouragement. That is why Paul urges Timothy to "rekindle the gift of God that is within you" (v. 6). Sometimes, our faith can feel like glowing embers. The fire is there, but it needs stirring. Life's pressures, fear, or weariness can cause it to fade. Yet Paul reminds us: "God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather a spirit of power and of love and self-discipline" (v. 7).

Is your faith aflame or in need of stirring? Like Timothy, you may have a legacy of faith nurtured by people like Mrs. Moran. Or you may be the first in your family to follow Christ. Either way, Paul's encouragement is the same: attend to your faith, embrace the grace given to you through Jesus, and live the gospel so that others may see it. God has entrusted you with a precious gift—your sincere faith.
