Jellied calves

I'm not afraid of heights. I'm afraid of edges. That made it hard the week my spouse, Jennie, and I spent a week at the Outer Banks, a string of barrier islands along the North Carolina coast, because we pledged to climb all the lighthouses.

I love the idea of lighthouses—beautiful, rock solid, maintained for the pure purpose of saving lives. But my calves turned to jelly each time I tackled interior steps with a sheer drop to my side. Then, once outside standing on the platform, my hands gripped the railing hard enough to leave fingerprints. The smile on my face was forced, I admit. However, I knew in my heart I was perfectly safe the whole time, and the climb was well worth the view of waves crashing on the shoreline, rolling hills, and the sunlight glaring off the frothing waves.

It's not clear if the hills to which the singer's eyes are lifted in Psalm 121 are real or symbolic, and we don't know if the path's edges induced jellied calves in some pilgrims climbing Mount Zion, but the dangers were heartfelt. Heights were considered ominous places. And if the threat of getting moonstruck was largely imaginary, the fear of the sun's intense rays was genuine.



The book explores Post's life journey from her beginnings of gluing cereal boxes as a young girl to help her father, to becoming the very wealthy and influential businesswoman, socialite, and philanthropist whose legacy as a presidential hostess helped to shape the political scene in Washington, DC. It also delves into Post's personal life, her four marriages, and her professional challenges as she built her own influence. The novel is set against the backdrop of early 20th century America, and it examines the complexities of wealth, power, and changing roles for women. Pataki's story chronicles Post's rise to become one of the wealthiest women in the United States, her inheritance of a vast fortune, and it

also highlights Post's acquisition of Russian art and jewelry that now forms the core of the much-visited Hillwood Museum outside of Washington.
