Keeping the faith

Our district has three dozen congregations and projects scattered over two states and some 50,000 square miles from north to south and east to west. Some are located in large cities or their suburbs. Some are in smaller cities. Many are out in the country or in very small towns, where water towers and grain elevators on the horizon signal that you're drawing near.

They range across the spectrum theologically, and they differ in style and personality. The buildings range from small to large, wood or stone or brick.

For all their differences, they all have at least one thing in common: These are often not easy times. Almost all have a smaller attendance than they did in the past. The pandemic delivered a beating. Aging buildings require increasing time and work. For some, finances can be a stretch, and most no longer have full-time pastors.

Those are realities. Yet in the midst of challenge, they have—like the apostle Paul—kept the faith. They worship. They fellowship. They pray. They support one another. In small ways, and sometimes in disproportionately large ones, they have had a positive impact on their communities.



The Magnificent Lives of Marjorie Post

by Allison Pataki

This book is historical fiction and reimagines the life of Marjorie Merriweather Post, heiress to the Postum Cereal Company, which eventually became General Foods. The book explores Post's life journey from her beginnings of gluing cereal boxes as a young girl to help her father, to becoming the very wealthy and influential businesswoman, socialite, and philanthropist whose legacy as a presidential hostess helped to shape the political scene in Washington, DC. It also delves into Post's personal life, her four marriages, and her professional challenges as she built her own influence. The novel is set against the backdrop of early 20th century America, and it examines the complexities of wealth, power, and changing roles for women. Pataki's story chronicles Post's rise to become one of the wealthiest women in the United States, her inheritance of a vast fortune, and it

also highlights Post's acquisition of Russian art and jewelry that now forms the core of the much-visited Hillwood Museum outside of Washington.
