A new song

I grew up in the church and love the harmonies that I've sung from our hymn books over the past seventy years. But the psalmist tells us to "sing to the Lord a new song . . ." (Psalm 98:1a). What does "a new song" mean? Are we simply to change from our trusty blue (or red, or . . .) hymnals to the latest praise songs projected on the wall?

Or is our new song to be our witness to God's salvation and righteousness in new ways, stretching us to "burst into jubilant song" (Psalm 98:4b) as we live and serve? Leaving the safe mooring we've always known in order to embark on a "new song" might require leaps of faith as well as some risks to our comfortable lives.


