Always thankful

As we approach a set apart time of "Thanksgiving" on the yearly calendar once again, it's okay to acknowledge that our human response to this holiday may also be fraught with disdain, prejudice, judgement or deep concern for the oppressive ugliness that hides behind festive cornucopia, bountiful tables, and family gatherings.

When my mom died in November 2022, I wrestled even more directly with the idea that we are supposed to be "always thankful." The last thing on my mind in my mourning and the lament of those early days without her was finding cause for gratitude. And yet, when Paul wrote to the Colossians from his prison cell, he called them (and us) back to the foundational gratitude expected of us as followers of Jesus.


Colossians 1:15-20 is essentially a hymn about Christ's work, a reminder that our thanksgiving is less about us and more about him as the first in and among everything, even our human understanding of collective sorrow and personal grief. By centering our love of Jesus and with spiritual understanding that we walk as God's holy people, we are indeed thankful for the release of darkness and freedom that comes from living in his light.

It is in this fullness that we move through difficult days with strength and fortitude because of who God is, participating in Christ's reconciling mission with "glorious might." As you set your tables and hearts with a spirit of thanksgiving this week, may you also walk in the Light of Jesus, braiding your brokenness and our ancestral ache into belonging, gratitude, and freedom of being fully known and fully loved by our Lord and Savior. Amen.
