Prepare the way

It's one thing to prepare dinner, or to prepare for finals, company, surgery, a move, a new profession. Practicing what we've learned and experienced, following prescribed procedures, modeling mentors and referring to DIY manuals, we manage to pull off change and challenge without falling on our faces. But "Prepare the way of the Lord?" Really? The prophets made good effort, remember?

Does anyone recall the fix John the Baptist found himself in for preaching that bearing fruit worthy of repentance was a much bigger deal than pedigree papers? And the One he is telling us to prepare for did not seem to take the fastest or easiest choices by Google map standards, prepared by generations of his faith ancestors. Preparation for any coming of the Lord is likely prefaced by a humble confession that we cannot predict or determine what "way" Jesus will take. Or take us. It appears he may favor detours over pavement.


Jesus frequently left the temple track to encounter the sick and hungry on hills instead of highways. Just when folks felt he'd set a sensible course, he dispatched them on a route that led through storm rather than serenity. He made more of a father who ran out to meet a son fresh from the pigpen than he made of a checklist proving he'd cleaned up his act. He suggested the dangerous Jericho Road, and the native population there, represented as likely a place for rescue and mercy as better-secured highways provided by church and state.

When it comes to preparing the way of the Lord, maybe we start by simply stepping out of the way. That could allow opportunity to discern which footprints are his, and to catch up to him in the places he's most likely to be caught again: neighborhoods off the beaten path, in the company of folks who are welcomed only there.
