## Take heart

People often say they don't dream, simply because they can't remember their dreams. I usually can, even when I'd prefer not to. Sometimes, frightening dreams wake me as I try—unsuccessfully—to scream; all that comes out is a faint squeak. The inability to vocalize my fear in those moments leaves me more afraid than the dream itself. Therefore, my greatest fear is having no voice.


The Judean exiles were people without a voice as they dwelt in a foreign country, so Isaiah portrays the joyful return to Zion as a vivid scene of song and color. A dry, dull wilderness explodes with gurgling fountains accompanied by the bright songs of blossoms. However, creation is not alone in acquiring a voice. The redeemed will be given a voice to sing and shout on the Holy Way. Those who trembled in the margins—the speechless, the lame, and the blind—will have a voice and the ability to dance their way home.

Numerous individuals within our communities lack the opportunity or permission to voice their perspectives. It is common to find ourselves among such neighbors. Together, we can take heart; God is here among us writing a new song for us to sing, rearranging the notes in the melody to create a song of mercy and justice. We can take heart; God has redeemed us through his anthem of love—Jesus Christ!
