While I haven't worked consistently during this time, I have found some reason to help out with their family farming operation for the last sixteen years. In that time, a friendship, bond, and trust has formed. It's more than just a job but rather a connection where worlds converge, bringing life experiences, knowledge, expertise, and some stubborn and witty personalities together. It's a true treasure that I have been blessed to be part of for many years.

In this experience, I have found themes of grace, accountability, heartache, disappointment, achievement, fulfillment—most importantly, all in the name of God's love. Placing my trust in this family and receiving their trust has demonstrated to me the psalmist's words: "The LORD's unfailing love surrounds the one who trusts in him (NIV)." Through the mistakes of broken equipment, inaccurately completed tasks, and countless other disappointments, the unconditional love of this farmer and his family still presents itself as a bonded connection in Christian faith and consistent grace that I will forever be grateful for.

The theme that rings through this psalm is grace—the grace of God that is bestowed on each of us as we encounter this Lenten journey on a wilderness walk with Jesus. It's an experience that will test ourselves and our faith much like Jesus felt leading up to his crucifixion. The human, relatable, and the graceful connections we see with Jesus allow us to have a more complete understanding in the complexity of God's love. A love filled with grace!




The Dearly Beloved

Against the backdrop of conflict and change facing the city and the church's congregation, these four forge improbable paths through their evolving relationships as each struggles with uncertainty, heartbreak, and joy. This book is a moving reflection on faith and reason, and the ways we find meaning in our lives.
